

ABOUT COMMUNITY ALL STARS:

The Community All Stars Program is a program for special needs children grades 1st through 12th who want to enjoy the full benefits of playing baseball in an athletic environment structured to their abilities.

This is a non-competitive co-ed program to introduce the basic skills of the game in a safe environment while having lots of fun. There are no strikes or outs and children hit the ball off a tee or pitched underhand by a coach based on the player's skill level. Volunteer "buddies" will assist the players as needed.

ELIGIBILITY

Boys and girls with special needs from the grades 1st through 12th are eligible to participate. All children must have a parent or adult guardian at the field at all times. Children from Long Hill, New Providence, Berkeley Heights, Summit and other local communities are welcome. This is a coed league.
