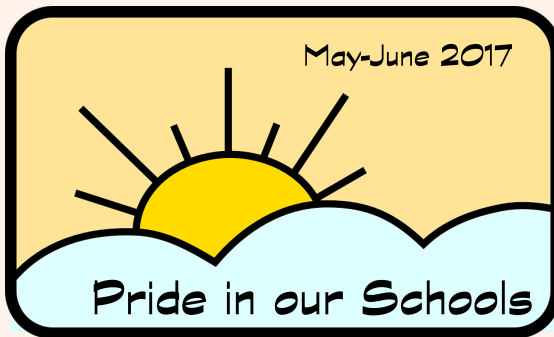




A Powerful Holocaust Lesson at Central.

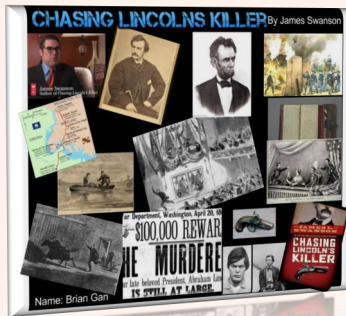

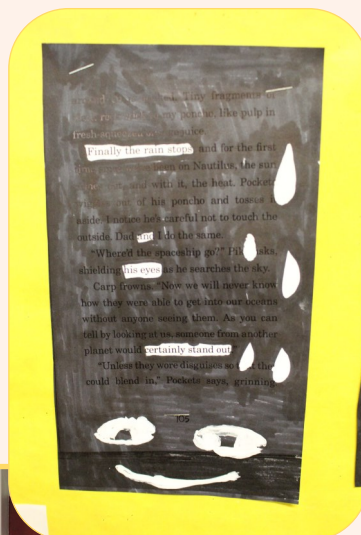


Mindfulness at Woodland.

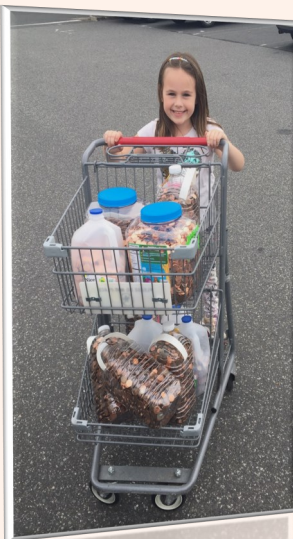

10th Annual Walk-a-thon at Warren Middle School nets more than \$10,000 for One Simple Wish.



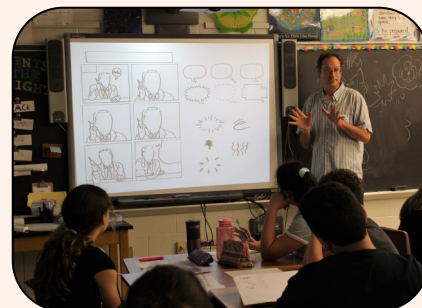
Penny Wars at Central raise more than \$1,000 for the World Wildlife Fund.

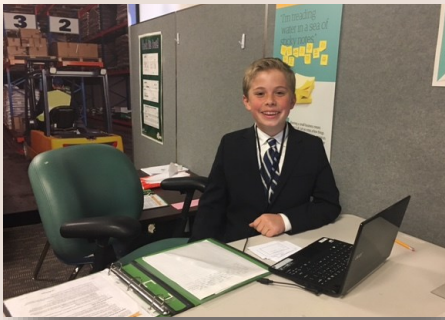


"Jeans for Troops" fundraiser at Central School with money raised going to housing and education for our nation's veterans.

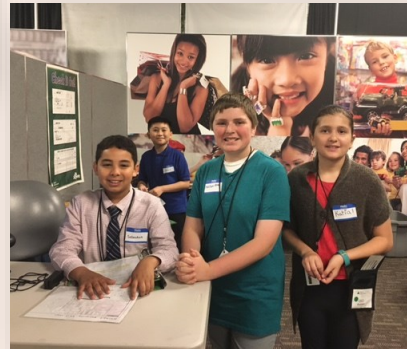

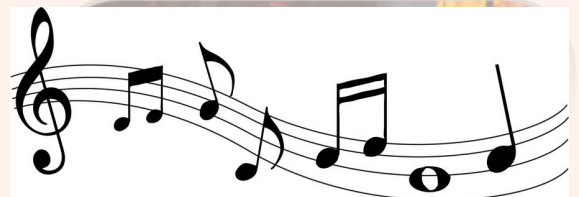
