Dear Parents,

There are several items of importance for this month.

Please be aware that the current dress code, as set forth by the Warren Township Board of Education under *Dress and Grooming Code*, remains the guidance policy for Mr. Achtau and me. It may be accessed on the district website under *Board Information – Policies – Students Dress Grooming Guide 5132*. We do expect students to adhere to this Code, especially in the warmer months ahead.

Students are not permitted to change buses unless there is an emergency circumstance, and only when prior approval is given by Jan Donlay, the head of transportation for the Warren School District. This policy exists for several reasons, one of which is to ensure that parents are aware that their child will not be home on the regular bus. The other is so that buses do not exceed the legal limit of passengers.

Continental Math

The final Continental Math competition took place in early March. Over 100 WMS students participated in this challenging mathematics event. Congratulations to all participants. Special recognition goes out to three eighth graders, one seventh grader and two sixth graders for scoring perfect "6" on every meet. These students will be honored with a national medal. 6th Grade E2

The 6th graders spend many class periods in E2 usually working on engineering, forensics, debate, math and quiz bowl challenges. Recently, the students made DNA key chains, DNA necklaces, mailed eggs using specific criteria, and used their thinking caps to solve many different problems and puzzles. In the months to come, the 6th graders will be working on a special project where they will research, plan, design, and build a 21st Century Skills contraption based on a series of criteria.

LEGO Robotics Project

The Middle School Design Challenge a non-competitive challenge open to middle schools in several New Jersey counties. This year's event will be held at Bridgewater-Raritan Middle School on Saturday, April 29th WMS will bring two teams to compete in this rigorous, technological challenge!! Good luck, teams!

The Warren Township Board of Education will hold a public hearing of the 2017-18 budget on April 24, 2017 at 7:00 PM in the All Purpose Room of Mt. Horeb School.

Next year's budget supports the continuation of all current programs and services including a comprehensive curriculum, support and enrichment services, and full-time guidance counselors in each building. The budget also maintains small class sizes in all grades, courtesy busing for all students, and late buses at Warren Middle School for students participating in clubs and activities. In addition, new scheduling models at all five schools will allow for even greater involvement in the arts, an expansion of physical education opportunities, and a more robust experience studying world languages while adjusting staffing levels to reflect the continued decline in student enrollment.

Thanks to the efforts of members of the Board and the school Business Administrator, I am proud to support a budget that provides for the wonderful education of Warren's children while being responsible to the taxpayer. The 17-18 budget increases the local tax levy by 0.71%. Detailed information about the budget can be found on the district's website.
