As we approach the winter months, we recognize that both illness and travel will keep students from attending school. The guiding practice is that the education of all students is most effective when students are present at school and ready to learn. We understand that school is only part of our students' lives and circumstances occur that keep children from school. When this happens, there are simple steps that can be observed to ensure that upon return to school, students are able to keep up with the instruction that happened in the classroom.

First, in the case of illness, we strongly encourage students to stay at home when not feeling well to recover. When students are not well, they may not be available for learning and can be better served by resting in order to improve their health. When a student is out due to illness, parents can request classwork and homework on the second, consecutive day out. To do so, parents should contact the grade level guidance counselor. Grade 6 is Ms. L. Regal ext. 5009, Grade 7 Ms. H. Scully ext. 5007, and Grade 8 Mrs. M. Johnson ext. 5005.

There are also occasions that require students to travel when school is in session. When this happens, parents may contact their child's teachers to request assignments in advance. Please note, this is not always feasible for the teachers and they may determine that work will be provided when a student returns. WMS procedure for make-up work is as follows:

Makeup Work

- * Students absent for any reason must make up assignments, class work, and tests within a reasonable period of time. It is the student's responsibility to obtain makeup assignments.
- * Students excused for field trips, concerts, competitions, etc., must make arrangements with the teacher to complete work missed prior to the absence.
- * When a student does not complete work missed for absence within the prescribed length of time, he/she is subject to receiving a failing grade for that assignment.


Wear Your Seatbelt - be a positive role model to those you are driving.
