Continental Math

The final Continental Math competition took place in early March. Over 70 WMS students participated in this challenging mathematics event this year. Congratulations to all participants. Special recognition goes out to three eighth graders, one seventh grader, and two sixth graders for scoring a perfect "6" on every meet. These students will be honored with a national medal. 6th Grade E2

The 6th graders spend many class periods in E2 usually working on engineering, forensics, debate, math, and quiz bowl challenges. Recently, the students made DNA key chains, DNA necklaces, mailed eggs using specific criteria, and used their thinking caps to solve many different problems and puzzles. In the months to come, the 6th graders will be working on a special project where they will research, plan, design, and build a 21st Century Skills contraption based on a series of criteria.

LEGO Robotics Project

The Middle School Design Challenge, a non-competitive challenge open to middle schools in several New Jersey counties. This year's event will be held at Bridgewater Middle School on Saturday, April 14th. WMS will bring a team to compete in this rigorous, technological challenge!! Good luck, Techies!

Solar Car Competition

Solar Car Competition preparation is in full swing!!! This will run as an E2 project as well as an After-school club on most Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays for those who returned permission slips. National Geography Challenge & National Language Arts Challenge

Superintendent's Corner

The Warren Township Board of Education will hold a public hearing of the 2018-19 budget on April 24, 2018 at 7:00pm in the Warren Middle School library.

Next year's budget supports the continuation of all current programs and services. In addition it:

- 1. Provides funding for security priorities.
- 2. Supports the implementation of a new master schedule at Warren Middle School.
- 3. Dedicates operating expenses as a deposit to capital reserves for future capital needs.
- 4. Increases the availability of mental health support staff for students.
- 5. Meets the demands of negotiated salary and benefit increases and increased fixed operational costs.
- 6. Expands enrichment opportunities for students.
- 7. Invests in updated classroom learning environments.
- 8. Reflects new revenues resulting from administrative changes in banking and after care providers.
- 9. Continues long-term replacement plans for vehicles, technology, and other equipment.

Thanks to the efforts of members of the Board and the school business administrator, I am proud to support a budget that provides for the wonderful education of Warren's children while being responsible to the taxpayer. The tentative budget approved by the Board on March 19, 2018, calls for a local tax levy increase of 1.51%. Detailed information about the budget can be found on the district's website.
