Dear Parents and Guardians,

Welcome to the 2018-2019 school year. Our new year brings a lot of positive change that we look forward to sharing with your children. This year we are fully integrating the redesigned master schedule for all grades. Each grade level is divided into Core Academic Teams (language arts, math, science, and social studies). In grades 6 and 7, students are either on the Blue or White Teams. In grade 8, students are on the Blue, White, or Red Team.

Each team has a common set of four Core Academic teachers that are responsible for the students on that team. Within the new master schedule, Core Team classes are fifty-two minutes and Encore (cycles, electives, and physical education and world languages) are forty-two minutes. All students are off team for Encore classes.

There will two Back to School Nights this year. Parents of grade 8 students will have BTSN on Tuesday, Sept. 25 from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. Parents of grades 6 and 7 students will have BTSN on Wednesday, Sept. 26. Both nights, there will be a special meeting for any parent who wishes to meet our new Assistant Principal, Ms. Maria Mensinger. This meeting will take place at 6:30 PM in the library.

We look forward to a great year ahead and the opportunity to work with you and your children to create an excellent educational experience.

Enrichment for All!

The E2 program provides a plethora of enrichment opportunities for all students, including trips, workshops, bees and competitions. Students are invited to sign up for these opportunities sometimes through Google Forms or by picking up a permission slip outside of room 32. Students are encouraged to listen to morning announcements as well as watch their emails for time sensitive information. 6th Grade E2 Evaluation Process

7th & 8th Grade E2

Students in the 7th and 8th grade E2 pullout program met with Mrs. Cooper to explore the elective offerings which will run from September to the end of December. Projects and activities include quiz bowl, mock trial, vehicles, photography, chess, math contests, leadership activities, trips, speakers and various workshops. All electives are student driven based on interest and will be scheduled on a bi-weekly calendar. Students are encouraged to watch the E2 easel and their email (and Google Classroom) for updates to the schedule and for new information. It is sure to be a great year filled with challenging enrichment opportunities for all.

Continental Math

Continental Math is a voluntary national math competition that is very popular at WMS. Five times each year, students have the opportunity to take a six question math challenge. No studying is expected, and answers are provided. Students should be sure to sign up for Continental Math through the Google Form that was sent to them on September 13th. Also, listen to the morning announcements for when the meets will begin.

Chess Club – OPEN TO ALL 6th, 7th and 8th Graders

Chess Club Adventures will meet after school on Wednesday in room 32. Chess allows students to develop and play with fellow students and high school chess team members. Chess is a wonderful way to use your mind and Chess Club Adventures promises many enriching chess opportunities. If your child is interested in Chess Club and did not sign up for it during club sign ups, contact Mrs. Cooper to see if open slots are available.

Peer to Peer Program

Dozens of eighth graders applied for the New Jersey Peer to Peer program at Warren Middle School. Twenty were chosen in preparation for a year of leadership development and service to the Warren community. Peer leaders are slated to conduct a series of outreach programs to younger peers in the district as well as run other projects that help influence children to stay away from drugs, alcohol and reckless behaviors.

The Warren Township Schools opened the 2018-2019 school year on September 6, 2018 with 1,683 students.
