# Halloween at Woodland



Our annual Halloween parade will be held on Tuesday, October 31, 2017 to provide an opportunity for students to share their costumes with friends, peers, teachers, and visitors. The parade will be held on the south side parking lot which provides ample space for all of our students to participate at the same time. Please assemble around the entire perimeter to ensure a great view for everyone. In the event of severe inclement weather, the parade will be inside the building with all visitors gathered in the APR and/or gymnasium.

Because the school's Halloween parade is not until 2:45pm, the students should not come to school dressed in costume. They will be given ample time to put on their costume before the parade. We do ask, however, that you send children to school with costumes that are manageable enough for the children to change into by themselves, or with minimal assistance. Below are some guidelines to ensure fun and safety for all involved:

- 1. Students may not wear any item which may create a safety hazard to the child or others.
- 2. Weapons of any type may not be part of the costume worn nor brought to school.
- 3. Masks that impair vision are not allowed. An eye patch, wig, and/or partial face covering are permitted.

Parking for this event will be available in both the front and north side parking lot. Once all of our spaces are filled, you may park on one side of the local streets and/or at the high school after their students' dismissal at 2:30. Please keep in mind that many children and adults will be outdoors and walking around. <u>Drive cautiously and stay alert</u>.

To help us ensure the most orderly dismissal, I encourage you to have your child take the school bus home after the parade. If you must take your child home with you after the parade, please send in a note to your child's teacher as early as possible so we can begin generating our pick up list. Students will line up in the APR with their homeroom teachers. Thank you for your cooperation and I look forward to seeing you at the parade. Adults are more than welcome to wear costumes, but please do not wear masks or any costume that might scare our younger students. Have a happy and safe Halloween.

#### Superintendent's Corner

The Warren Township School District kicked off the 2017-2018 school year on September 7, 2017. Schools opened with 1746 students and over 30 new staff members after an incredibly busy summer of work in the district. Thanks to the hard work and dedication of the buildings and grounds and technology departments, the buildings were gleaming and ready for students upon their arrival with a few key changes: reconfiguration of entrances at Angelo L. Tomaso and Mt. Horeb schools to increase safety and security, new water bottle filling stations in all five schools, the installation of pilot active learning space classrooms throughout the district, the replacement of every light bulb in the elementary schools as part of a state program to increase energy efficiency, and the implementation of a new visitor management system at all schools that dramatically improves our ability to control access to the buildings while schools are in session.

On the curriculum and instruction front, students are experiencing adjusted master schedules that increased time for health and physical education in grades K-5 and time for core academic instruction and the arts in grade 6. The curricula for all elementary science classes were updated to reflect changes in state requirements and world languages curricula were amended to reflect an instructional philosophy that focuses on conversation and consistent practice with the target language.

Of course, all of this is done within the framework of a whole child approach to education where we strive to ensure that each student is healthy, safe, engaged, supported, and challenged in our schools. I look forward to a wonderful 2017-2018 school year and working with the entire Warren Township Schools community to continue *shining* brighter every day!

#### A Note from the School Nurse:

Children spread germs very quickly and easily without knowing it, even though they are reminded to wash their hands and cover their coughs and sneezes. These seemingly small illnesses can have a serious and/or detrimental affect on anyone who is immuno-compromised or immuno-deficient. In an effort to prevent the spread of germs from one student to another and to safeguard the health of both the students and the staff, here are some guidelines that should help you in making an informed decision about whether or not to send your child to school. If your child is sick please keep them home.

<u>Strep Throat</u>—Students may return to school <u>24-48 hours</u> after the first dose of antibiotic therapy has been started, in accordance with your doctor's orders. The student must feel well enough to attend, and must not present with any other signs or symptoms, such as elevated temperature. (The strep virus can cause scarlet fever/scarlet fever, if left untreated.)

<u>Fever</u>—Students may return to school <u>when their temperature has been normal for at least 24 hours,</u> without having taken temperature-lowering medication.

<u>Cold and Cough</u>—Students should stay home if they are too uncomfortable to complete work. Students should also stay home if they have a **persistent or severe cough**. Students may return to school when their temperature and activity level have returned to normal.

<u>Vomiting/Diarrhea</u>—<u>Students should be symptom free for 24 hours and be able to hold down</u> food and fluids before returning to school.

<u>Skin Rashes</u>—If the student exhibits a skin rash of undetermined origin, please consult your physician before sending the student to school. A doctor's note stating the condition is not contagious may be necessary for the student to return to school.

<u>Conjunctivitis</u>—If a student has been diagnosed as having conjunctivitis, they may return to school with a doctor's note stating they are being treated for the condition, and they are no longer contagious. The student should have no evidence of a discharge from the eyes.
