During the hands-on "gemstone mining" activity the students were able to dig, identify, classify and keep specimens of rocks, minerals, and gemstones. They also learned that almost everything around us was created because people have taken something out of the ground and turned it into a materiel that we use in our everyday lives.

The Anti-bullying Bill of Rights Act designates a week in October as a Week of Respect in New Jersey. Daily slogans led the way such as "Be a Positive Problem Solver" and "Take a Stand-Lend a Hand".
