The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding the universal and correct wearing of masks in elementary and secondary school facilities. When those guidelines conflict, the Warren Township School District intends to follow the guidelines set forth by the NJDOH unless directed otherwise by the local public health official.

The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding physical distancing. guidelines which will allow students to be spaced at distances in excess of CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines.

In addition, opportunities for hand hygiene will be built into each student's daily routine.

The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding cleaning and maintaining healthy facilities, including improving ventilation. The district recently underwent several capital projects to improve HVAC systems. Additional projects for HVAC systems and window and door replacement are anticipated in the coming years to continue improving ventilation. School nurses and custodians will implement existing district protocols to enhance cleaning of facilities when illness levels require.

5) Contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with the State, local, territorial, or Tribal health departments

The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding contact tracing in combination with isolation and quarantine, in collaboration with state and local health officials. This includes the continuation of existing protocols for engaging the local health official each time there is a positive COVID-19 case affecting a student or staff member to coordinate a response.

The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding diagnostic

and screening testing. The District applied for and anticipates receiving authorization to operate a COVID-19 testing facility at Warren Middle School.

The Warren Township School District intends to follow current CDC, NJDOE, and NJDOH guidelines, as well as any relevant legislation or executive orders signed by the Governor of New Jersey regarding efforts to provide vaccinations to educators, other staff, and students, if eligible. The District previously facilitated connecting all adults who desired a vaccine with vaccine providers. The District held a vaccine clinic for eligible students in June 2021. The District will work with vaccine providers to hold vaccine clinics for additional students as they become eligible.

The Warren Township Schools ensures continuity of services by providing a comprehensive multi-tiered system of supports based in a whole child philosophy that addresses student academic, social, and personal needs. This approach includes extended day tutoring and mentoring programs with individual students and/or small groups. In addition, positions like Social Emotional Learning specialists have been onboarded to focus on student and staff's SEL priorities. The district maintains an Emergency Virtual Instruction plan that includes 1:1 Chromebook access for all students and 1:1 staff access to tablets. In addition, families are surveyed every year to address any potential challenges that may exist with Internet access.

Board of education committees and presentations focus on core aspects of the plan. All Board committees provide updates to the public. Members of the public can comment on any committee reports. In addition, the BOE continues to provide the public the ability to comment on meetings via Zoom which invites a much higher rate of participation than would otherwise occur. A weekly Community Briefing is also issued every Friday to the entire school community.
