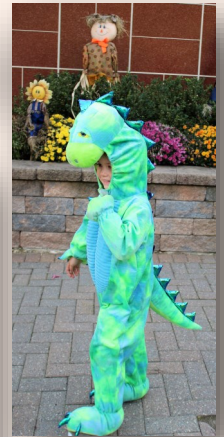

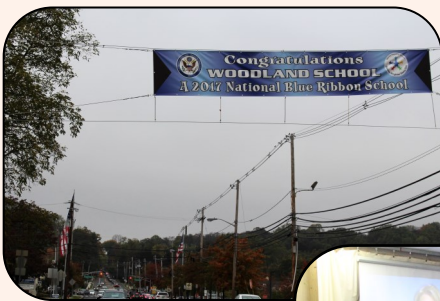




Warren Middle School Upstanders

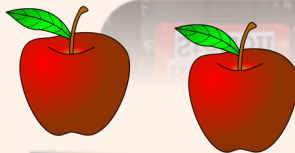

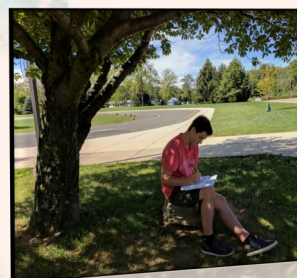

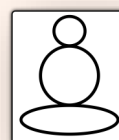

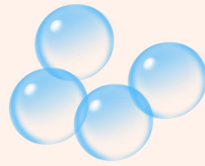

At Woodland, thanks to a generous PTO 'Dream it, Fund it' grant, students practice mindful breathing in the new Zen Den with Diane Langworthy.

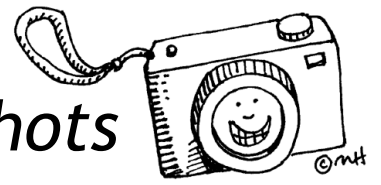

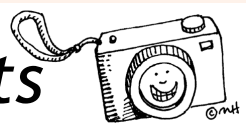
