

Carver died on January 5, 1943 in Tuskegee
Alabama. He died in his home. He was
approximately 79 years old. Dr. Carver had
been sick for many months and could not get
out of his bed for the last ten days. Dr.
Carver will be honored for his work in the
field of plant research and for making
peanut products.


Do you like peanuts? Would you like to learn about peanuts? George Washington Carver was a person who invented all kinds of things made out of peanuts and helped to spread the word about peanuts.



George Washington
Carver was born into
slavery in Missouri during
the Civil War. While we
did not know when he was
born, people said that he
must be born in the 1860s.
His father died before he

was born and shortly after that, slave traders kidnapped his mother. So the owners, Moses and Susan Carver, raised him. When Dr. Carver was a child, Susan Carver taught George about plants and plant medicine. Then later, George helped his neighbors fix their plants.

At age ten, George left home. Later, he went to Iowa State Agricultural College and he was the first African American student. Later, he was a leader at Tuskegee Institute, one of the first colleges for



African Americans in America.

Dr. Carver persuaded farmers all across the country, especially the poor farmers, to rotate the crops to help keep the soil fertile. So he figured out crop rotation of different foods. He would tell farmers to plant cotton one year and the next year, he would tell them to swap in sweet potatoes or soybeans or peanuts. Farmers did not know what to do with the peanuts and they could not make money from them. To boost demand, Carver developed hundreds of peanut-based products! Items like soap, paper, shaving cream, lotion, flour, and insulation are all examples of peanut-based products. In a few years, the peanut market was booming.

Note: Dr. George Washington Carver was a great scientist of plants. Without him, we would not have many of the peanut-based products we now have. The next time you go to Texas Roadhouse or if you are eating peanuts, don't forget to think of George Washington Carver.


iBuild Masterpieces




Reporter Olivia Grochowski:

and why his/her readers would be interested, and then waited to hear back." After the editor accepted her idea, she did a lot of research. She "decided who to interview and what questions to ask." Mrs. McGann said that she wrote her first draft after being "armed with lots of information and quotes". She made sure that she began her article with a hook -- a lead paragraph, she said, should "grab the reader and make the reader want to read more".

Mrs. McGann knew that along the way these tips and tricks would be handy to our Mount Horeb Gilly Gazette staff. She reviewed with us that the body of our articles should tell us "who, what, where, when and why, plus some interesting facts that might surprise the reader". One new suggestion that Mrs. McGann shared was the importance of reading your article out loud after you have edited it several times. She says that this is very important because it helps us "to hear how the words sound together and whether they make sense". Many of the Gilly Gazette writers followed Mrs. McGann's advice and found it to be helpful.

Mrs. McGann shared a presentation on the Smart-Board that included one of her exciting CNN videos in which she was the reporter. She shared some examples of her newspaper and magazine articles. After we read the articles, we participated in activities that helped us understand the important steps for researching and writing a factual and exciting piece of print journalism.


